9th April 2010	By Notification No. 43/2010-Customs dated 9th April, 2010, Government of India withdrew exemption granted to Raw Cotton and Cotton Waste from payment of Customs Duty. This resulted in imposition of export duty on cotton.
	Further by Notification No.44/2010-Customs dated 9th April 2010, the GOI restricted exports duty on Cotton Waste to 3% advalorem.
19th April 2010	By Press Note bearing No.1/162/2010/Cotton/Vol.IV/357 dated 19th April 2010, registration of Export Contracts for Raw Cotton, Cotton Waste (including yarn waste and garnetted stock) and cotton carded or combed were suspended with effect from 19th April 2010.
	Further, Export Authorisation Registration Certificates (EARCs) issued prior to the closing hours of 19th April 2010 and having valid shipment period with unshipped quantity were required to be revalidated.
21st May 2010	By Notification No.44/2009-14 dated 21st May 2010, requirement to register contracts for cotton exports with the office of the Textile Commissioner was dispensed with and exports of Raw Cotton and Cotton Waste were placed in the restricted list with the nature of restriction being "Exports permitted under Licence".
17th August 2010	By Notification No.58/2009-14 dated 17th August 2010, Exports of Raw Cotton and Cotton Waste were placed in the free list and export of cotton was allowed w.e.f. 1st October 2010.
7th September 2010	By Press Note No.1/162/2010/Cotton/Vol.VIII/13 dated 7th September 2010, it was announced that the Textile Commissioner will commence registration of Export Contracts for Raw Cotton, Cotton Waste and Cotton, carded or combed from 15th September 2010. Further, by the said Press Note, introduction of the online system for filing of applications for Exports Authorisation Registration Certificates (EARCs) was announced.
15th September 2010	By Press Note No.1/162/2010/Cotton/Vol.VIII/138 dated 15th September 2010, it was announced by the Textile Commissioner that registration of contracts for Exports of Raw Cotton, Cotton Waste, and Cotton, carded or combed has been deferred to 1st October 2010 instead of 15th September 2010.
30th September 2010	By Press Note No.1/162/2010/Cotton/Vol.VIII/222 dated 30th September 2010, Textile Commissioner announced that contracts for exports of Raw Cotton for an aggregate quantity of 55 lakh bales will be registered on first-come-first basis with effect from 1st October 2010 and the 45 days of shipment period to be allowed would be reckoned from the date of issue of EARC or 15th December 2010, whichever is later. By the said Press Note, it was further notified that actual export (i.e. shipment) would commence from 1st November 2010 instead of 1st October 2010 notified earlier.
1st October 2010	By Notification No.105/2010-Customs dated 1st October 2010, the Government amended Notification No.11/89-Customs dated 1st March 1989 to insert Raw Cotton and Cotton Waste in the table containing description of items/goods exempt from payment of Customs Duty.
	Further, by Notification 106/2010-Customs and Notification No.107/2010-Customs, both dated 1st October 2010, the Government rescinded earlier Notification Nos.44/2010-Customs dated 9th April 2010 and 59/2010-Customs dated 10th May 2010 to exempt exports of Raw Cotton and Cotton Waste from the payment of Customs Duty.
16th December 2010	By Notification No.12(RE-2010)/2009-14 dated 16th December 2010, it has been decided to shift Registration of Contracts for Exports of Cotton, Cotton Waste from the Office of the Textile Commissioner to DGFT.
31st March 2011	By Public Notice No. 45 (RE-2010) /2009-14 dated 31st March 2011, DEPB benefits on export of cotton were withdrawn retrospectively from 21st April 2010 onwards.
9th June 2011	By Notification No.57 (RE-2010)/2009-14 dated 9th June 2011, cap on cotton exports has been increased from 55 lakh bales to 65 lakh bales during the current cotton season 2010-11 (upto 30th September 2011).
2nd August 2011	By Notification No.62 (RE-2010)/2009-2014 dated the 2nd August 2011, the Director General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) notified that the cap on export of cotton has been removed but the exporters have to be registered the contracts for export of cotton with the DGFT prior to shipment.
4th August 2011	By Public Notice No.68/2009-2014 (RE-2010) dated 4th August 2011, DEPB benefits were again resumed retrospectively in respect of export made on or after 1st October 2010.
12th September 2011	By Notification No.74 (RE-2010)/2009-14 dated the 12th September 2011 the Director General of Foreign Trade (DGFT), has notified that export of cotton will continue to be free during the next season also subject to registration of contracts with DGFT.
5th March 2012	By Notification No.102 (RE-2010)/2009-14 dated the 5th March 2012, the Director General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) prohibited export of cotton till further orders.
12th March 2012	By Notification No.106 (RE-2010)/2009-14 dated the 12th March 2012, export of cotton was again placed in the free list. However, issue of new Registration Certificates (RCs) continued to remain suspended.
16th March 2012	By Public Notice No. 102 (RE-2010) / 2009-2014 dated the 16th March 2012, the Director General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) notified procedure / guidelines for scrutiny and revalidation of Registration Certificates (RCs) that were valid as on 5th March 2012.
4th May 2012	By Notification No. 113 (RE-2010) / 2009-2014 dated the 4th May 2012, the Government withdrew suspension of issue of new RCs and allowed further registration of cotton export subject to a maximum limit of 10,000 bales at a time for each exporter.
1st October 2012	By Notification No. 18 (RE-2012)/2009-14 dated the 1st October 2012, the Director General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) notified that export of 5000 bales of Assam Comilla cotton will be exempted from any export restrictions subject to registration with DGFT.

30th November 2012	By Notification No. 26 (RE-2012)/2009-14 dated the 30th November 2012, the Director General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) increased the maximum limit for obtaining RCs from 10,000 bales to 30,000 bales and allowed multiple issue of RCs within this eligibility.
3rd January 2014	By Notification No. 63 (RE-2013)/ 2009-14 dated 3rd January 2014 the DGFT has announced that there shall be no requirement of submitting any document in electronic filing for obtaining Registration Certificates (RCs).
8th December 2014	By Notification Nos. 102 (RE-2013)/2009-14 and Notification No. 103 (RE-2013)/2009-14 both dated the 8th December 2014, the Director General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) dispensed the requirement of the registration of export of cotton (Tariff Codes 5201 and 5203) and Cotton Yarn (Tariff Codes 5205, 5206 and 5207).

Chapter 2

The *Chakravyuha* Challenge of The Indian Economy

Box: Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code 2015

The Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2015' was introduced in the Lok Sabha on 21st December 2015. The Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2015(I & B Code-2015) would enable the businesses, companies and their workers to come out of unviable ventures quickly besides freeing up locked up money of creditors for disbursing to other investors

2. Need for a Bankruptcy Law:

The existing legal framework for insolvency and bankruptcy is spread across multiple statutes and is found to be inadequate resulting in undue delays in resolution and thus rendering it ineffective, at times. In an economy growing at a rapid pace and aspiring to achieve 10% GDP growth not only the credit delivery mechanism but the economic culture surrounding it needs to be as per best global practice. Thus there is need for an effective statutory framework to deal with insolvency and bankruptcy to facilitate development of credit markets in the country, encourage entrepreneurship, improving ease of doing business, facilitate investments, create more employment opportunities leading to higher economic growth and development.

3. Bankruptcy Law Reforms Committee

A Bankruptcy Law Reforms Committee (BLRC), set up on 22.8.2014, under the Chairmanship of Dr. T K Viswanathan, ex-Law Secretary and ex-Secretary General Lok Sabha for providing an entrepreneur friendly legal bankruptcy framework for India, as announced in the Budget Speech (2014-15). BLRC submitted its Report and draft Bill to the Finance Minister on 4.11.2015. Based on this and consultation a draft Bill, namely 'The Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2015' was introduced in the Lok Sabha on 21st December 2015. It has been referred to a Joint Committee of Parliament.

4. Salient features of 'The Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2015'

- i) The Proposed framework aims to ensure –
 - early detection of stress in a business;
 - initiation of insolvency resolution process by debtor, financial or operational creditor;
 - timely revival of viable businesses;
 - liquidation of unviable businesses;
 - minimization of losses to all stakeholders; and
 - avoiding destruction of value of failed business.
- ii) Consolidation of Laws relating to companies, limited liability entities, partnerships and individuals, into a single legislation.
- iii) Providing time bound insolvency resolution process.
- iv) Involving Regulated Insolvency Professionals and Involving Creditors.
- v) A swift process time and bound process.
- vi) A well defined order of priorities [waterfall] for realisation of proceeds of liquidated assets.
- vii) Voluntary Liquidation facility to corporate debtor.
- viii) Bankruptcy and Insolvency Processes for Individuals and Unlimited Liability Partnerships.
- ix) Agency Framework with entity wise Adjudicating Authority like National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) for companies and limited liability entities and Debt Recovery Tribunal (DRT) for individuals and unlimited partnership firms and Appellate Authorities National Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT).
- x) Insolvency Regulator called the "Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India" to exercise regulatory oversight over insolvency professionals, insolvency professional agencies and informational utilities.

Chapter 4

Agriculture: More from Less

Technical Appendix

To calculate the retail wedges over wholesale prices two pieces of data were used. For the year 2014, monthly average wholesale prices in APMC markets from www.agmarknet.in and monthly retail prices from Ministry of Agriculture. There are 85 retail reporting centers in the country. Each reporting center to APMC markets in their district were matched. To calculate the markup, for each month the modal price in each market and retail center was taken and the markup for the month, crop, market-retail-pair was calculated. Then the average markup for each crop by state was calculated.

To calculate the wholesale wedges over farm gate, the National Sample Statistical Organization's 70th round survey of assessment of agricultural households, 2013 and, wholesale prices from APMC markets has been used. The sale prices reported by farmers to all possible *mandis* within the same district as the village in which the survey was conducted were matched. The village-*mandi* pairs that result in a negative wedge (assuming that the trade would have occurred only if intermediaries could recover their costs) were discarded. The median value of the wedge from the remaining set of village-*mandi* pairs were chosen. These farmer level wedges were then used to arrive at a state level estimate by weighing the data by NSSO's frequency weights.

Appendix 4

This gravity relationship of trade can be expressed as a simple equation:

$$M_{ijt} = \alpha \frac{Y_{it} Y_{jt}}{D_{ij}}$$

Or in logarithms as:

$$\log M_{ijt} = \alpha + \log Y_{it} + \log Y_{jt} - \log D_{ijt}$$

Here, M_{ijt} is trade flows between exporter country i and importer country j in year t . Y is the GDP of country and D the distance between them. α is just a constant of proportionality.

Finally, the basic econometric specification that implements this approach is the following:

$$\log M_{ijt} = \alpha + \beta_1 \log Y_{it} + \beta_2 \log Y_{jt} + \beta_3 FTA_{ijt} + \lambda_t + \gamma_i + \gamma_j + \epsilon_{ijt}$$

Here, λ_t is a year fixed effect, γ_i and γ_j are exporter and importer specific fixed effects. The fixed effects, crudely put, help capture year, exporter and importer specific unobservable effects on trade - allowing to create the counterfactual. FTA_{ijt} is a dummy that =1 if countries i and j are FTA partners in year t and 0 otherwise. This helps capture the effect of the FTA. This specification is modified the later to make full use of the disaggregated tariff and trade data collected at the 6-digit product level.

The other common approach is to use a Computable General Equilibrium (CGE) model. However, this is primarily meant for an “ex-ante” analysis that simulates the effects of trade. This approach is also not very robust to choice of the modelling assumptions and values of parameters¹.

Appendix 5

In order to measure the effects of FTAs using the gravity specification as outlined earlier, we rely on values of exports, imports and associated tariff rates at a country, product (at 6-digit HS codes) and year-wise level of disaggregation. Because this data has not been compiled previously by any of the studies cited above, we pool data from different sources to construct our underlying country-product-year wise dataset. The data collation strategy is outlined below:

1. *Trade Values:*

- a. The value of Indian imports at six digit HS product classification for 2005-2014 has been acquired from the Directorate General of Commercial Intelligence and Statistics (DGCI&S).
- b. The value of exports from India to all other countries has been acquired from CEPII's - BACI trade dataset. This choice was based on the fact that CEPII collects bi-directional flow of trade from different pairs of countries and uses analytical methods to correct for misreporting or exclusion errors in reporting trade values between trading pairs.

2. *Tariff Rates:*

- a. *MFN and FTA rates for Imports to India* - The tariff rates for most favoured nation (MFN) and FTA within 2005-2014 has been collected from the Ministry of Commerce and Industry. Given that the HS code classification has changed during the said periods, we ensure that MFN and FTA tariff rates for Imports to India are consistent with their respective trade values and their revised HS classification codes.
- b. *MFN rates for exports from India to non-FTA countries and FTA countries during non-FTA years:* These tariff rates have been procured from the World Bank and WTO's TRAINS database. As earlier, we ensure that the tariff rates provided by the database is are consistent with their corresponding nomenclature in CEPII-BACI's' export dataset.
- c. *FTA rates for exports from India to FTA countries during FTA years:* These tariffs were collected from government websites of respective countries. According to the agreements uploaded by ministries of respective countries, the Japan and ASEAN FTA export tariff schedule is based on HS07 nomenclature, whereas Korea FTA export schedule is based on HS02 nomenclature.

The resulting dataset comprises of 56 countries and their respective trade values and tariff rates. All petroleum products are dropped from the finalised dataset. In line with aggregate trade patterns, China appears in the dataset as the biggest trading partner for goods.
